

An Overview of the Class of 2020

Since graduating from St Cuthbert's our 161 Year 13 students have gone on to pursue a broad range of tertiary education and employment or GAP experiences:

- 123 (69%) students studying at New Zealand tertiary institutions
- 28 (24%) students will move to study at overseas tertiary institutions
- 12 (7%) students undertaking a GAP year

The trend for students to move south to undertake their tertiary studies continues. The University of Otago and the Victoria University of Wellington remain popular choices for the 2020 Cohort with 40% opting for either of these. The University of Auckland remains the number one choice although some students who are currently attending are still waiting for offers from overseas universities*. The number of students applying to overseas universities has risen, however many students have deferred places until next year and/or are beginning study programs online, due to the issues created by COVID-19.

*A significant trend is the number of students beginning conjoint degrees.
